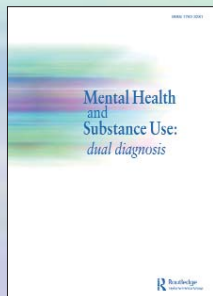


Mental Health and Substance Use: *dual diagnosis*
