What is HBDDxC?

AOD and mental health workers can face challenges in working effectively with people with dual diagnosis and other complex needs. Often the most effective responses occur when AOD & MH workers work together. While working together sounds good it can be challenging to find opportunities to build strong relationships with people in the 'other' sector.

Hume-Border Dual Diagnosis Collaborative (HBDDxC) is a cross-sector (Alcohol & Other Drug, Clinical Mental Health and Mental Health Community Support) group of AOD-Mental Health workers interested in improved outcomes for people experiencing co-occurring mental health-substance use issues (dual diagnosis).

The HBDDxC is all about building opportunities for AOD and Mental Health (Clinical & MHCS) workers to meet and build strong relationships that are needed for cross sector collaborations and navigable treatment pathways.

We do this through a range of activities including:

- Joint Education
- Randomised Coffee Trials
- Cross sector agreements
- Bus trips
